- Biotech at SHHS- Biotechnology is an ever-expanding field that involves cutting-edge technology and that is saving lives. All of the universities in Utah have robust biotechnology programs which multiple majors in this filed that are doing incredible things in many areas of scientific research. According to the Utah Governor's Office website, "The life sciences industry has a significant impact on the Utah economy. In fiscal year 2015, the Utah life sciences industry cluster (as defined by GOED) represented 961 companies and more than 26,900 jobs. These jobs paid an average of \$62,337 a year, or 161% of Utah average wages." Students taking this class can receive three credit hours of UVU concurrent enrollment credit (BTEC1010) which fulfills the GE Biological Science university requirement. This class includes lab work with DNA analysis, genetic engineering, protein analysis, electrophoresis, PCR and chromatography, as well as many lab skills and techniques. Students learn the science behind many current topics of interest (i.e. cloning, stem cell research, environmental biotechnology, disease diagnosis, epidemiology and disease transmission). - AP Environmental Science is doing a Soil Testing Fundraiser- Those who have tried gardening in Utah might have struggled to grow because the soil's pH problems and nutrient deficiencies. Students in AP Environmental Science from Salem Hills High will be testing soil to identify these very problems. This fundraiser is a joint effort with the AP students and the school's Enviro-thon teams who will compete in the 2017 Utah Enviro-thon competition in April in Richfield. AP Environmental Science is an incredibly valuable class for many reasons. The class counts for both AP credit and UVU

Concurrent Enrollment college credit. Students taking AP Environmental Science can receive three credit hours of college GE Physical Science and if students pass the AP Exam with a three or higher, they will receive another three credit hours for Environmental Biology which is a GE Biological Science course. This one high school class could potentially equate six or more college credits of science courses. BYU also accepts the credits as the Global and Cultural Awareness credit which is part of their GE requirements. Students who plan to attend BYU or UVU should consider taking this class. - AP Biology (Biology 1610) and Biology 1010: Two Options for Concurrent Enrollment Biology Credit- Salem Hills High School will be offering two options for college biology courses during the 2017-18 school year. The first thing to note is that AP Biology(Biology 1610/1615 is concurrent enrollment class (5 credit hours at UVU), but offers more credit (6 to 8 credit hours) at most colleges and universities in Utah and across the U.S. for passing the AP Biology Exam with a score of 3 or higher at the end of the year. Whereas, Biology 1010/1015 offers only the 4 credit hours of UVU which can be transferred to other in-state colleges and universities, but may not be accepted at out-of-state colleges or universities.
