Students will sell Starving Student Cards. They will collect money in exchange for the cards they sell to friends/family (not door-to-door) and give all those monies to the finance office. At the conclusion of the fundraiser, all unsold cards will be returned and students will be charged for any unaccounted-for cards. A percentage of each sale goes to the provider of the fundraiser with the remainder going toward the student tour cost. Excess funds raised may be used for other orchestra-related expenses or donated to the orchestra program (but will not be applied to other school expenses or refunded to students).

Describe any transportation or supervision needed to complete the fundraiser, and explain how potential risks or safety concerns will be addressed.

Students will sell the cards on their own, not while being supervised. There should be minimal safety concerns, since students will only be selling to friends/family.

 - The parents/guardians of elementary students must give permission for their students to participate.
 - Raffles are illegal in Utah and are, therefore, prohibited as a fundraising effort.
 - Door-to-door sales are prohibited.
 - Potential risk concerns, including student safety, transportation issues, and appropriate supervision.
